The umbrella falls here called the Randha falls, are breathtaking as several streamlets cascade down 45 metres from the lake. These are used for hydropower generation. We relaxed here listening to the soothing sound of waterfalls, while enjoying a picnic lunch of sandwiches and fruit.
