G.V. Viswanath, a tenth standard student of Gitanjali Public School spelled 21 words correctly in two and a half minutes and won the championship. G. Ahlaad, a tenth standard student from Jubille Hills Public School, was the first runner up as he spelled 19 words.

The task of spelling words was even tougher as the spell master was John Shulman, an American writer and lawyer. The finals were conducted in three rounds of warm up, buzzer and rapid fire rounds. Five students from three schools in the city were shortlisted for the championship from a pool of over 2000 students, who had participated in the earlier contests.

Spelling competence is one of the tools which can be used to test the overall English competency levels among students. The objective behind the competition was to promote the importance of English and making school managements and teachers, emphasize quality learning, said, Spellbrain India Private Limited Chief Executive Officer, Murthy Korlapati. A retired I.A.S. officer M. Gopala Krishna, who was the chief guest for the event presented cash awards for the winners.
