I used to collect the seeds and sell them to a provision shop on Mosque Street. A day's collection would fetch me (B) <u>the princely sum of one anna</u>. My brother -in-law Jallaluddin would tell me stories (C) <u>about the War</u> which I would later attempt to trace in the headlines (D) <u>in Dinamani</u>. Our area, being isolated, was completely unaffected by the War. But soon India was forced to join the Allied Forces and something like a state of emergency was declared.
