INTRODUCTION

The Andhra Veterinary College was started on 15th July, 1955 at Bapatla. Subsequently, the College was shifted to Tirupati during 1957. Consequent to the formation of A.P. Agricultural University (presently named as Acharya N.G.Ranga Agricultural University), this college came into its fold from July 10, 1964 and subsequently under the control of Sri Venkateswara Veterinary University.

During Golden Jubilee year celebration of the College of Veterinary Science, Tirupati during July, 2004-2005, the then Hon'ble Chief Minister, while inaugurating the Golden Jubilee Celebration on 30th September, 2004 announced the formation of Sri Venkateswara Veterinary University at Tirupati by bifurcating ANGRAU. This was done keeping in view the improvement of livestock and aquaculture farming for the overall development of the economy of the farming community of the State. Accordingly the Andhra Pradesh State Government enacted Act.No.18 of 2005 which came into force on June 21, 2005.

The second Veterinary College in the state viz. NTR College of Veterinary Science was started at Gannavaram, Krishna District during the Academic Year 1997-1998 and the third Veterinary College was established at Proddatur, Kadapa District during the academic year 2008-09. The fourth Veterinary College was established at Garividi, Vizianagaram District during the academic year 2020-21.

The Dairy Technology programme started in the year 1983 was elevated as College of Dairy Technology, Tirupati during 2009. This is only one of its kind of College under A.P. State Government offering B.Tech (Dairy Technology) and PG courses in M.Tech (Dairy Technology) and M.Tech (Dairy Microbiology) with primary objective of imparting Quality education in Dairy processing for generation of manpower much needed by dairy, food and allied sectors. Dairy Technology College is also training rural youth and women dairy farmers in various skill development programmes for self-sustainability by using surplus milk.

The Mandate of the University is to strengthen teaching, farmer oriented research and extension activities in Veterinary and allied fields. The university imparts education leading to the award of P.G. degree i.e. Master of Veterinary Science (MVSc) in the faculty of Veterinary Science in 17 (Seventeen) disciplines.

1. Institutions under S.V.V.U

Pydah College of Dairy and Food Technology, Patavala, East Godavari Dist.

In addition of the above colleges, the SVVU also produces AH Diploma holders through Ten (10) University Animal Husbandry Polytechnics and twelve (12) affiliated Animal Husbandry Polytechnics. Further the University takes up the research activities for the improvement of productivity of livestock, germplasm development etc. through 9 (nine) research institutions at various locations of the state. In addition SVVU has one KVK at Lam, Guntur and CCVEC at Tirupati to carryout extension activities and one Super Specialty Veterinary Hospital at Vizag.

ADMISSIONS

2. Number of seats

Applications are invited from the candidates who appeared ICAR AIEEA (PG) Entrance Test 2023 belonging to Andhra Pradesh for 85% seats and candidates of both Andhra Pradesh and Telengana for 15% seats. However candidates from Telangana are not eligible for stipend. The number of seats available in each major field of study are shown in Appendix – II

3. Qualifications

a) Education

Candidates seeking admission into MVSc must have passed the BVSc & AH examination from any institution accredited by VCI with minimum OGPA of:

6.00/10.00 for general category (for SC/ST/PH: 5.00/10.00) or equivalent to 60% marks (for SC/ST/PH: 55%).

Only residents of AP are eligible for admission except in case of ICAR Quota. However, candidates from Telengana States may compete along with AP state candidates for seats under 15% un-reserved quota as per eligibility. Candidates with MVSc qualification are eligible for admission into second PG programme but such candidates are not eligible for stipend. Candidates who are already prosecuting MVSc are eligible to apply for PG admission in another discipline. But stipend paid earlier will be recovered with interest and his/her earlier admission shall stand cancelled irrespective of stage of standing. However such candidates are eligible for stipend in fresh course.

- (b) Age: The upper age limit is 40 years as on the date of notification
- 4 <u>Reservation for Local & Non-Local candidates</u>: Residence of A.P(AU/SVU) are eligible for the 85% of the available seats. 15% (AU/SVU/OU) of the total seats are earmarked for unreserved category and are allotted to candidates hailing from A.P State and Telengana State. However stipend will be paid to the candidates of A.P State only.

5. How to apply:

The applications shall be downloaded from the University website, www.svvu.edu.in. The downloaded and duly filled in downloaded application along with copies of required certificates and copy of the counterfoil of Registration Fee paid @ Rs.1400/-, (Rs750/- in case of SC/ST/PH candidates) exclusive of commission charges of Bank through online preferably in Union Bank of India or any Nationalized bank favouring COMPTROLLER, SVVU, payable at Union Bank of India, Thummalagunta branch, Tirupati, Account No:209810100016530, IFSC Code:UBIN0820989 having UTR No./Transaction ID, should reach the Registrar, SVVU, Administrative Office, Dr.Y.S.R. Bhavan, Tirupati – 517 502 on or before 03.06.2024 by 4.00 p.m. either in person or by Registered Post with Acknowledgement due. Application received after this due date and timevwill summarily be rejected. Candidates who are in employment should send their applications through proper channel. The University is not responsible for any postal delay.

- 6. Those already employed shall send their applications through their employers so as to reach the University before the last date prescribed. Applications of employed candidates which are not submitted through employer shall not be considered.
- 7. **Enclosures to the application:** The candidates should submit copies of the following certificates along with the application. Documents enclosed to the application shall not be returned. Hence candidates are advised to enclose **only copies of the following certificates.**
 - a) A counterfoil with self attested UTR No for Rs.1400/- for general and BC category and Rs.700/- for SC/ST/PH category candidates.
 - b) Memoranda of marks (all years) obtained at the qualifying (BVSc & AH) examination or transcript and 10th Class/SSC examinations.
 - c) Provisional/Degree certificates of the qualifying examination (BVSc & AH).
 - d) ICAR-AIEEA (PG) 2023 Rank card and Admit Card:
 - e) Study Certificates from the Heads of recognized Institutions from IV class onwards or Residence Certificate or a certificate from the employer as the case may be (Vide Appendix). Those who have continuously studied in recognized educational institutions should enclose study certificates. Residence Certificates will not be accepted in such cases. Those who have a break in the year of study for reasons other than failure or those who passed the examination by private study should submit residence certificates in the prescribed proforma enclosed in annexure.
 - f) **Social Status Certificates** issued by the competent authority in case of candidates belonging to BC/SC/ST. The admissions given under this quota shall be provisional till the genuineness of the social status claim of the candidate is certified by the respective Departments of the Government.

- g) Certificate regarding NCC/ Sports & Games /defense personnel (CAP)/Scouts and Guides, from competent authority in case of special category candidates.
- h) Date of birth certificate or S.S.C certificate where date of birth is mentioned.
- i) Persons with Disabilities certificate should enclose certificate (Sadaram)

Note: As per Indian Veterinary Council Act, 1984 (52 of 1984) and VCI MSVE 2016 Regulations a candidates shall not be allowed admission to Bachelor of Veterinary Science and Animal husbandry degree course if he or she suffers the following disability and the same conditions shall be applicable for admission into MVSc course.

- i) Disability of total body including disability of chest or spine more than 50%
- ii) Disability of lower limbs of more than 50%
- iii) Disability of upper limb
- iv) Visually handicapped candidates and those with hearing disability
- v) Candidates with progressive disease like myopathies etc.
- vi) Disabilities which otherwise would interfere in the performance of the duties of veterinarian.
- j) Nativity and Residence Certificate
- **k)** The candidates claiming reservation under EWS category have to enclose certificate as per format in Annexure-I of the application for the academic year 2023-24.
- I) Certificate showing the formula for conversion of OGPA/CGPA into marks in respect of candidates who passed their examination from universities other than S.V.Veterinary University.
- m) 10 +2 (Intermediate) marks memo and
- n) Transfer certificate from the institute last studied
- Migration Certificate if the candidates passed qualifying examination from a University other than SVVU.

Note: All the originals of the above certificates should be produced at the time of counseling

8. Selection

- a) Selection Criteria: Selection of candidates for admission into MVSc courses shall be based on ICAR AIEEA (PG)-2023 ranks under the streams of Animal Biotechnology, Animal Science and Veterinary Science streams.
- b) Allocation of seat to PG course in different departments shall be done as per the procedure given below:
 - i) As Number of seats in all departments in each stream put together are small in number, <u>common</u> roaster system for all departments will be followed.
 - ii) The seats shall be reserved in favour of SC, ST, BC as follows: 15% to scheduled Caste (SC), 6% to Scheduled Tribes (ST) and 29% to Backward Classes (BC). Reservation to BC will be further divided as follows; BC-A 7%, BC-B 10%, BC-C 1%, BC-D 7% and BC-E 4%.
 - iii) 33% seats will be reserved for women and 5% of seats to Persons with Disabilities (PwD) as per the Government norms. The eligibility under PwD is as per VCI specifications. The candidates claiming the seat under PwD should attend in person with relevant certificates for verification by the concerned Medical authorities on **06.06.2024** by **9.00** A.M

Note: As per Indian Veterinary Council Act, 1984 (52 of 1984) and VCI MSVE 2016 Regulations a candidates shall not be allowed admission to Bachelor of Veterinary Science and Animal husbandry degree course if he or she suffers the following disability and the same conditions shall be applicable for admission into MVSc course.

- i) Disability of total body including disability of chest or spine more than 50%
- i) Disability of lower limbs of more than 50%
- ii) Disability of upper limb
- iii) Visually handicapped candidates and those with hearing disability
- iv) Candidates with progressive disease like myopathies etc.
- v) Disabilities which otherwise would interfere in the performance of the duties of veterinarian.
- iv) 10% seats over and above the sanctioned seats are earmarked for EWS as per G.O.Ms.No.60 (BC w(f)) department, Dated: 27.07.2019 & G.O MS.No.39 HE (EC), Dated: 30.07.2019.

- v) Note: As it is not possible to represent all social groups/local areas in a single discipline, candidates belonging to different social groups shall be distributed in different major fields of study available in such courses.
- vi) Candidates applying for admission should appear in person for counseling at their own cost.
- vii) Selected candidates shall have to produce all necessary original certificates including those of educational qualifications, ICAR-AIEEA (PG) 2023 hall ticket and rank card, pay the prescribed fee and register the courses at allotted college on the prescribed date. Failure to do so entails forfeiture of claim for the seat.
- viii) Allocation of seats under other special category are as follows. The candidates claiming the following special categories should attend in person with relevant certificates for verification by the concerned authorities on **06.06.2024** by **9.00** AM.
 - a) Children of Armed Personnel (CAP) ... 2%
 - b) National Cadet Corps. (NCC) ... 1%
- 9. The list of eligible candidates for counseling will be displayed on University Website on **07.06.2024**

11. General

- i) If a particular subject is offered in more than one College, subject and college shall be allotted during counseling process. PG students should necessarily complete the PG programme in the College where they joined.
- ii) The PG students should not be on the active rolls of employment of Government or University or any other organization (private or public) while fulfilling the minimum residential requirement of the course.

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- a. PG students should not register for any other degree/diploma programme concurrently on regular or part-time basis either in this University or in any other University/Educational Institution.
- b. Those who were withdrawn from M.V.Sc courses in SVVU for not maintaining minimum OGPA and again applying during subsequent years, should appear and seek admission afresh.
- c. Those who joined M.V.Sc courses in SVVU but could not complete the requirement may appear again for counseling as fresh candidate. However, stipend if any paid earlier shall be recovered in full.
- iv. All admissions shall be deemed as provisional and subject to further scrutiny. The admission shall be liable for cancellation without notice at any stage during the study of the students if it is found that his/her admission is in any way repugnant to the rules/ regulations or invalid by reason of incorrect or false information furnished by the applicants or their parents/guardians at the time of admission. Any cancellation of admission shall not exclude penal action under the relevant criminal law.
- v. The University reserves to itself the right to cancel or vary any of these rules without prior notice.
- vi. Based on the ICAR –AIEEA (PG) 2023 ranks a merit list of qualified candidates for Animal Biotechnology, Animal Science and Veterinary Science streams will be prepared and displayed on the university website.
- vii. Counseling will be done for allotment of seats in Departments and College based on the merit in their respective stream and the decision of university is final in this regard.
- viii. The in-service candidates sponsored by Government/Industry are exempted from appearing ICAR-AIEEA (PG) 2023.
- ix. Candidates shall visit the University website from time to time for the updates and no personal communication shall be sent to the applicants.
- x. If seats reserved for ST category are not filled up, they shall be open to SC category and vice versa. In the event of candidates from SC & ST are not available these seats shall be allotted to the candidates under open competition. If qualified candidates belonging to BC of particular group are not available the left over seats will be adjusted for the candidates of next group. If qualified candidates belonging to BC are not available to fill up the seats reserved for them, the left over seats shall be allotted to open category.
- xi. Claims of candidates shall not be considered, if they are absent when called at the time of counseling.

- xii. If Special category candidates are not available those seats shall be filled as per Government rules.
- xiii. The candidates selected during 1^{st} counseling including in-service candidates on deputation EOL have to admit themselves on **14.06.2024** failing which his/her admission stands cancelled.

APPENDIX - I

Reservation of seats in favour of Local/Non Local candidates

(In accordance with the A.P. Educational Institutions (Regulation of Admissions) Order, 1974.)

- A. (i) Admission to 85% of the seats in each major field of study after excluding those reserved for the candidates from outside the State, shall be reserved in favour of and allocated among the local candidates in relation to the local area in respect of the Andhra University and Sri Venkateswara University at the ratio of 44:22 respectively.
 - ii) While determining the number of seats to be reserved in favour of the local candidates under sub para (i) any fraction of a seat shall be counted as one provided that there shall be at least one unreserved seat.
 - iii) While allocating under Sub-Para (i) the reserved seats among the local candidates in relation to the different local areas, fraction of seat shall be adjusted by counting the greatest fraction as one and if necessary also the greater of the remaining fractions as another and where the fraction to be so counted cannot be selected by reason of the fractions being equal the selection shall be by lot, provided that there shall be at least one seat allocated for the local candidates in respect of each local area.
 - iv) If a local candidate in respect of a local area is not available to fill any seat reserved or allocated in favour of a local candidate in respect of local area, such seat shall be filled as if it had not been reserved.

Local Candidates

- A candidate for admission to any course of study shall be regarded as a local candidate in relation to a local area:
 - a) If he has studied in an educational institution or educational institutions in such local area for a period of not less than four consecutive academic years ending with the academic year in which he appeared or, first appeared in the relevant qualifying examination as the case may be.

OR

- b) Where, during the whole or any part of the four consecutive academic year ending with the academic year in which he appeared or, as the case may be, first appeared for the relevant qualifying examination, he has not studied in any educational institution, if he has resided in that local area for a period of not less than four years immediately preceding the date of commencement of the relevant qualifying examination in which he appeared or, first appeared as the case may be.
- 2. A candidate for admission to any course of study who is not regarded as a local candidate under sub paragraph (i) in relation to any local area shall:
 - a) If he has studied in educational institutions in the State for a period of not less than seven consecutive academic years ending with the academic year in which he appeared or, as the case may be, first appeared for the relevant qualifying examination be regarded as a local candidate in relation to;
 - i) Such local area where he has studied for the maximum period out of the said period of seven years;

OR

ii) Where the periods of his study in two or more local areas are equal, such local area where he has studied last in such equal periods:

OF

b) If, during the whole or any part of the seven consecutive academic years ending with the academic year in which he appeared or as the case may be, first appeared for the relevant qualifying examination, he has not studied in the educational institutions in any local area, but has resided in the state during the whole of the said period of seven years, be regarded as a local candidate in relation to:

i) Such local area where he has resided for the maximum period out of the said period of seven years;

OR

ii) Where the periods of his residence in two or more local areas are equal, such local area where he has resided last in such equal periods.

Explanation: For the purpose of this paragraph.

- i) "Educational institution" means a University or any educational institution recognized by the state Government or a University or other competent authority:
- ii) "Relevant qualifying examination" in relation to admission to any course of study, means the examination a pass in which is minimum educational qualification for admission to such course of study:
- iii) In reckoning the consecutive academic years during which a candidate has studied, any period of interruption of his study by reason of his failure to pass any examination shall be disregarded. Any period of his study in a State-wide University or a State-wide Educational Institution shall also be disregarded:
- iv) The question whether any candidate for admission to any course of study has resided in any local area shall be determined with reference to the places where the candidate actually resided and not with reference to the residence of his parent or other guardian.

Local Area

The part of the State comprising the districts of Srikakulam, Vizianagraram, Vishakhapatnam, West Godavari, East Godavari, Krishna, Guntur and Prakasam shall be regarded as the local area in respect of the **Andhra University**. The part of the State comprising the districts of Anantapur, Kadapa, Kurnool, Chittoor and Nellore shall be regarded as the local area in respect of **Sri Venkateswara University**.

- **B.** The following categories of candidates will be considered against the 15% of the available seats left **unreserved.**
 - a) All candidates belonging to different local areas (AU, SVU and OU).
 - b) Candidates who have resided in the State for a total period of ten years excluding periods of study outside the State or either of whose parents have resided in the State for ten years excluding period of employment outside the State;
 - c) Candidates whose parents are employed by the State or Central Government / Public Sector/ Corporations/ Local Bodies/Universities and similar other Quasi-Government Institutions within the State.
 - d) Candidates who are spouses of those employed by the State or Central Government/Public Sector/ Corporations/ Local Bodies/ Universities and similar other Quasi –Government Institutions within the state.
 - e) Candidates who are employed by the State, Central Government Undertakings/ Public Institutions within the state.

Note:

- State means Andhra Pradesh
- In case of candidates who passed B.V.Sc & A.H. from state wide university / institution only the period of study prior to joining the University will be reckoned for determining the Local/Nonlocal status of the candidate.

M.V.Sc Seats offered for candidate sponsored by Industries

- 4 (Four) M.V.Sc seats over and above the regular seats are allotted for candidates sponsored by Industries in all the PG disciplines put together.
- Each industry can sponsor only one candidate and they are exempted from appearing ICAR-AIEEA(PG).
- The applicant should have minimum of 2 years of experience in sponsoring industry and evidence of salary particulars with bank statement and proof of filing of IT returns of at least two financial years should be enclosed.
- If the these seats are not filled up, they shall not be converted into fresh/in service quota
- The fee per semester shall be Rs.15,000/- for industry sponsored candidates besides fee applicable to regular candidates
- They are not eligible for stipend.
